## Event Date & Description:

6/28/2011 --- Contract workers removed due to violation of drug and alcohol policy.

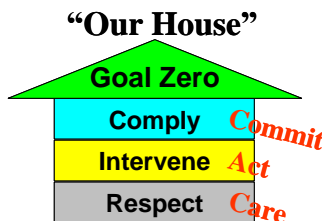
<p><b><u>What happened?</u></b></p> <p>Prohibited items were discovered through random testing, random contraband searches, witnessed events, or for cause testing.</p>
<p><b><u>Which Life Saving Rule(s) involved:</u></b></p> <p>No alcohol or drugs while working or driving.</p>
<p><b><u>Investigation results:</u></b></p> <p>The contract workers were aware and understood the Life Saving Rules and the consequences.</p>
<p><b><u>Action taken:</u></b></p> <p>The contract workers were placed on the no fly list and will not be allowed on Shell locations.</p>
<p><b><u>Key Learning Points:</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Do not use or possess drugs, alcohol, or prohibited substances</li><li>2) If you choose to break the rules, you choose not to work for Shell</li></ol>

It is about saving lives, and it is working.

Everyone should ensure that we know the rules, follow the rules, and always intervene if there is the potential for unsafe behaviors or conditions. This applies to everyone: peers, supervisors, and visitors.

If in doubt, always consult your supervisor.
