

Learning from Life Saving Rule events

The following is a short summary of a Life Saving Rule event, investigation, follow up, and learning opportunities.

It is intended to help share information and learn from each event to prevent future occurrences. It is about Saving Lives.

Event Date and Description: [2010-03-05; Taking photographs while driving](#)

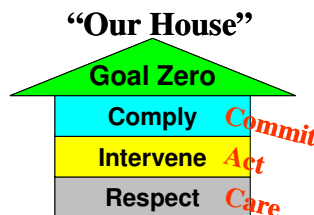
What happened: A worker took photographs of other vehicles while he was driving on the highway. The worker shared these photographs at the morning meeting for the purpose of sharing a humorous picture. The event was escalated by a meeting attendee and reported to the PIC.
Which Life Saving Rule(s) involved: While driving, do not use your phone and do not exceed speed limits
Investigation results: The worker took the photographs with a digital camera while driving from home to the heliport. The worker was not using a cell phone to talk, send or read text messages. The worker was not on company business, company reimbursed mileage, or in a company vehicle. The worker failed to recognize risk, showed poor judgment, and exhibited unsafe driving behaviors. This event was not a Life Saving Rule violation.
Action taken: The worker was coached on driving safety and the need to exhibit safety leadership behaviors and he will share the learning with the local offshore community.
Key Learning Points: The need to focus on the task at hand, recognize at-risk behaviors & unsafe acts, which could potentially lead to injury or death (i.e. think before acting on impulse), and identify and mitigate exposure.

It is about saving lives, and it is working.

Everyone should ensure that we know the rules, follow the rules, and always intervene if there is the potential for unsafe behaviors or conditions. This applies to everyone: peers, supervisors, and visitors.

If in doubt, always consult your supervisor.
